
Quotes from the programme

A Historical Event of 238th Years Way of the Cross at St. Joseph's Church, Pezar, Mangalore



St Joseph church, Pezar is situated at a distance of 20 kms from Mangalore and is one of the most ancient churches in Mangalore diocese. It existed here even before 1670. The history of the parish for the period from 1800 to 1864, written in Portuguese language is available.

The celebration of Passion of our Lord Jesus on Tuesday of the Holy

Week is a unique religious tradition, which started after the return of the captives from Srirangapattana, in remembering those people who laid down their life for the faith during the captivity under Tipu and celebrated with religious fervour.

On April 18, 2000, Stations of the Cross were erected and the Calvary Grotto was built.

April 12th 2022 was a memorable day for all the Catholics, as the historical event of 238th year of the Way of the Cross was held at St Joseph Church, Pezar, Kalavar, Mangalore.

The passion of Lord Jesus Christ was exhibited as a mark of tradition with true reverence. With a solemn Holy Eucharist celebrated by Dr Peter Paul Saldana, Bishop of Mangalore diocese, along with priests of the Diocese and the faithful, this event builds the faith of Community in the present situation.
