CHRISTMAS - Discovering Our Connectedness



Christmas is a season of connectedness. It celebrates the connectedness of human beings with God and with one another. The expression of our connectedness, however, sometimes tends to get ritualistic.

Parties, celebrations, and family dinners, often allow us to feel good as long as we are in the company but lonely the moment, we leave it. One way of escape from this loneliness is the discovery that our connectedness results not so much from what we do together but we are. The celebration of Christmas is basically about "who we are".

Christmas gives us the good news that God is with us. But it also shows us that

finding Him is only possible if we are willing to go beyond images, words, and thoughts, in which we give up trying to fashion a God according to our image and likeness, and discover Him as God who is the center of our being.

This is the secret of the shepherds and the wise men. They were willing to go beyond the outward "form" to the substance of things. So, when a caregiver(nurse) connects with someone whose body is wasting away beyond recognition, and a mother can still recognize the face of her son beyond his disfigured body, when we are able to see in an AIDS victim a basic human dignity that has remained untarnished, when we can connect with the poor and marginalized for no other reason than the discovery that we are bonded together by our participation in the life that comes from God, then we know that we have found the saviour.

This is the God who dwells in us and whose coming we celebrate at Christmas. Silent night is a popular Christmas carol. It speaks of the silence that is so characteristic of God's presence. Listen to the silent music of another's heart until you find a rhythm that emerges, and then gradually begin to make from within you a sound that matches the melody and rhythm of what you hear. Then you will experience a communion, a oneness of being that binds you together. It will be your best-loved Christmas carol. – **Sisters from Dindigul**
