



Interculturality Workshop - Asia Oceania



International online workshop on Interculturality organised by UISG was held from 6th to 11 March 2023. It was a great privilege to take part in this workshop in which 60 congregations took part. We were four PDDM sisters, Sr Maria from Australia, Sr Cristina from Philippines and Sr Columba from Korea and myself from India. My sincere thanks to Sr M Celine Cunha and the Team for giving me this opportunity. I am also grateful to Sr Giovanna Uchino the General Councillor who coordinated with UISG to help us attend the seminar.

It was unique experience that enriched me personally. I discovered that the intercultural issues are serious issues and need to be addressed carefully. All the communities especially international communities need to be empowered to live in a supernatural way observing Gospel values. The whole week had been a wonderful exercise of learning, unlearning, and relearning about interculturality and various aspects that affect intercultural community living. Being aware that we are children of the same Father, we learn to accept each other's differences knowing that we are called for a specific mission and that mission can be accomplished only by harmonious living.

All the sessions were given by well-known and well-prepared speakers.

Sr Mary John, in her talk said that all the cultures and countries have something good to contribute. Therefore, the attitude of tolerance, respect, curiosity, empathy towards other cultures is very essential. We were born cultureless, and then as we grew up, we acquired it from people around us. For no culture is perfect, all are in a process of evolution and need to be evangelised.

From Fr Robert's talk I learned that all should move from tolerance of differences to appreciation and celebration of differences. This is a great challenge to those who look down on others and devalue their contribution based on their cultural background. To see others from God's eyes is a must to be true religious. It is a supernatural faith-based living that requires compromise, real vision, and dialogue. A revolution of interculturality in religious life specially in international community is very essential for survival.

Sr Paula took us to the monoculture of Jesus and the openness he had for a change towards intercultural sensitivity with different experiences and persons. The examples from the Scripture, The Canaanite woman, The Samaritan woman, and Good Samaritan were apt examples that depicted how Jesus dealt with intercultural issues.

What we need the most is dialogue that makes space, openness that gives way to change and stepping forward without getting offended creates understanding.

Intercultural community living and reconciliation by Sr Miriam has given lot of inputs to be adapted by intercultural community that faces challenges. To address intercultural issues courageously, to verify before judging and to forgive and reconcile. To own our wounds in God's presence and allow him to embrace our woundedness and hurt.

Sr Patricia Murray has well dealt on Interculturality, leadership and vows. A leader is expected to live Gospel values of empathy, openness, mutual sharing, hospitality, inclusiveness and to develop deep connectedness.

As a whole we were given sufficient knowledge in few days on interculturality. Sharing in groups opened us to the realities of international communities that face intercultural conflicts. This workshop will certainly yield good fruit in our personal lives as well as in our mission. I thank Sr Paula, Sr Cristina and the entire organising team for their meticulous arrangements.
