"It is not good that man should be alone"



Youth Meet, January 13 - 15, 2024 St. Joseph's Community College, Jamshedpur

On the occasion of the centenary of our foundation, the community of Jamshedpur organized a three-day 'Youth Meet' with the desire to share our life and mission with the young people. It was a wonderful scene to see our campus being filled with young people and their parents.

The day was opened with a prayer led by Sr Reshma. Since the young people were from different parishes the ice-breaker activities were conducted to make the youth feel at home in the company of each other. Then, they were invited to introduce themselves creatively. After which, some general questions were posed on current topics on universal and local church, and finally we introduced our

congregation by way of a video clip on our life and mission. The input sessions on the first day, was given by Fr. Alex Darwin from the Diocese of Jamshedpur who has specialization Psychology and Youth Counseling. He dealt with "What is true happiness and where can it be found, within outside". or During the second session. he administered personality



assessment questionnaires and helped them to know their strengths and weak areas. To keep young people active and engaged along with the input sessions, games, and action songs were conducted.

On the second day, Fr. Valerian Lobo, the Director for Catechetical and Pastoral training programs in the diocese and the Deputy Secretary of the Bishops Conference - Jharkhand, gave sessions on 'Understanding the Ten Commandments', 'Character Building according to Kingdom Values', and 'Christian Witness'. He enlightened them through various dynamics and video clips to build a pleasant character and keep away from evil habits and immoral acts.

On the third day, the Vincentian priests Fr Martin and Fr Riyo from Divya Jyoti Retreat Center dealt with the topic 'Love and Live the Word of God' by instructing the youth to prioritize their daily habits so that they can set aside time for prayer and reading the word of God. When faced with failures or discouragement they remind themselves that the negative thoughts come from the evil one and firmly root their trust in God who is omnipotent and go forward in the hope to face the challenges of daily life.



The 'Youth Meet 2024' was concluded with the Eucharistic Adoration and Holy Mass. Each of the participants received a Bible diary as a gift, and the Catholic Students from our St Joseph's Community College were also given the Bible diary. It was a memorable event for the participants and

the community. The young people expressed the desire that they look forward to having such gatherings in the coming days.
